COAST LIFE SUPPORT CPR TRAINING CENTER

Coast Life Support's goal is a District-wide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Education Program which focuses on providing CPR training to targeted groups and the community at large. The desired impacts are to keep first responders well trained and to increase the incidence of bystander initiated CPR to improve the chance of survival from cardiac arrest for residents and visitors in the Coast Life Support District.

BLS FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS—Classroom & Online Skills Assessment

The Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers Classroom Course is designed to provide a wide variety of healthcare professionals the ability to recognize several life-threatening emergencies, provide CPR, use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), and relieve choking in a safe, timely and effective manner.

Class length—Initial: 4.5 hours ~ Renewal: 4 hours ~ Classroom Skills Assessment: 1 hour Community members taught: Local Fire Dept.1st Responders & RCMS staff

HEARTSAVER CPR AED

Heartsaver® CPR AED is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches adult and child CPR and AED use, as well as how to relieve choking on an adult. This course teaches skills with the American Heart Associations' (AHA) research-proven Practice-While-Watching (PWW) technique, which allows instructors to observe the students, provide feedback and guide the students' learning of skills. Class length—3-4 hours

HEARTSAVER FIRST AID CPR AED—available in Spanish

Heartsaver® First Aid CPR AED is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches students critical skills needed to respond to and manage a first aid, choking or sudden cardiac arrest emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services (EMS) arrives. Students learn skills such as how to treat bleeding, sprains, broken bones, shock and other first aid emergencies. This course also teaches adult and child CPR and AED use. Class length—5-7 hours

HEARTSAVER FIRST AID

Heartsaver® First Aid is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches students critical skills to respond to and manage an emergency in the first few minutes until emergency medical services (EMS) arrives. Students learn skills such as how to treat bleeding, sprains, broken bones, shock and other first aid emergencies.

Class length—2-3 hours

HEARTSAVER PEDIATRIC FIRST AID CPR AED

The Heartsaver Pediatric First Aid CPR AED Course is designed to meet the regulatory requirements for child care workers in all 50 United States. It teaches child care providers and others to respond to and manage illnesses and injuries in a child or infant in the first few minutes until professional help arrives.

Class length—7-9 hours


FAMILY & FRIENDS CPR (Hands-Only CPR)

The Family & Friends CPR Course teaches the lifesaving skills of adult Hands-OnlyTM CPR, child CPR with breaths, adult and child AED use, infant CPR and relief of choking in an adult, child or infant. Skills are taught in a dynamic group environment by using the AHA's research-proven practice-while-watching technique, which provides students with the most hands-on CPR practice time possible.

- o All classes are taught to American Heart Association (AHA) standards.
- o The Heartsaver CPR/AED or Heartsaver First Aid CPR/AED are taught every other month, on a rotation, to the Community. These classes are free.
